4-H Agriculture and Natural Resources Updates:

•4-H Essay Contest: The Power of Pollen

- * The 2026 National 4-H Beekeeping Essay Competition is now open and must be submitted to our office no later than 5pm on April 23rd, 2026 for consideration. We will send it to the State 4-H office, who will select a state winner and submit it to the National contest.
- * Winners of the National Competition will have their essays published in the ABF (American Beekeeping Federation) Quarterly, be given a complimentary registration to the next ABF annual conference, and receive a relevant book on honey bees, beekeeping, or honey.
- * In addition to the above prizes, the highest-scoring essay will win \$750, the second-highest scorer will win \$500, and the third-highest scorer will win \$250 in cash prizes.
- * If you are interested in submitting an essay, please contact the County Office for the Topic parameters or email the Ag Agent at angeladh@nmsu.edu.

Feeling stressed, rushed, or excited increases vulnerability

Anyone can be tricked!



Common Red Flags

- ▶ Pressure to act immediately ("Act now!")
- ▶ Requests for personal or financial information
- ▶ Promises that sound too good to be true
- ▶ Threats or fear-based tactics
- ▶ Hidden fees or fine print

Why Scams Work

Manipulate emotions: fear, excitement, urgency

Create a false sense of scarcity or opportunity

Exploit financial stress or lack of information



Spotting Scams & Protecting Your Money



Types of Scams

- Phishing emails/texts
- Fake prizes/giveaways
- Impersonation
- Subscription traps
- Fake job offers

Questions to Ask Before Sharing Information

- ✓ Do I know who is contacting me?
- ✓ Can I verify this independently?
- ✓ Am I being pressured to act quickly?
- ✓ Would a trusted adult advise me to share this info?
- ✓ Does this feel too good to be true?

PROTECTED

How to Protect Yourself

- Pause and think before responding
- Verify the company or source
- Never share passwords, banking info, or personal details
- Compare offers and research reviews

MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING

According to State 4-H policy, a 4-H member shall attend at **least 40%** of all club meeting and activities. If a 4-H member does not meet this requirement, they will not be a member in good standing.

Current Torrance County 4-H By-Laws state for a member to remain in good standing the member must complete the following :

1. **Attend 50% (6) regular club meetings during the current 4-H year and attend (4) prior to County Fair.**
2. **Keep records of projects and turn them into the club leader.**
3. **Give a demonstration or illustrated talk.**
4. **Participate in two or more community service projects and two or more club activities and two or more club or county fundraisers.**
5. **Meet all of the requirements before exhibiting any projects. Members must be enrolled in the projects they are exhibiting.**
6. **Exhibit projects at County/State Fair**

4. Under 'You have earned a certificate' is a button that says "Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)'
5. Click on the blue 'Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)'
6. Start Course

Complete course and a certificate will be available with the completion date. The county 4-H Zsuite administrator should be able to see the volunteer completion on his/her county page.
