## 2023 New Mexico State 4-H Dog School

The 2023 New Mexico State 4-H Dog School will be held in Bernalillo County, Albuquerque, NM on June 23, 24 and 25, 2023.

### What is a Dog School all about?

The New Mexico State 4-H Dog School was designed to help 4-H youth become familiar with the 4-H Dog Project through the different events youth may participate in with their dogs and to promote "Responsible Dog Ownership". The two days are filled with workshops where the youth receive instruction from professional dog trainers in Obedience, Rally-Obedience, Agility, and Showmanship with their dogs. We offer different levels of learning in each event – a beginning and an intermediate/advanced. In addition, we bring in people from different organizations or groups that will demonstrate other dog events and/or occupations with dogs. The youth are given the opportunity to give a Presentation or Demonstration related to the Dog Project on Saturday night. The 4-H youth and their dog or dogs may compete in the events of Showmanship, Obedience, Rally-O and Agility.
