- If you have never used Zsuites before, start by creating a new account. If you have an existing Zsuite account, log in with your username and password.

Make sure to download the medical form, fill it out, and then upload the signed copy to each household member's accounts. You will not be approved on the county level until those forms are attached to your enrollment and complete with signatures. You can also auto sign if you have the Adobe feature.

Once you have completed enrollments, you will be approved by the county OR state (for volunteers).

#### MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING

According to State 4-H policy, a 4-H member shall attend at **least** 40% of all club meeting and activities. If a 4-H member does not meet this

requirement, they will not be a member in good standing.

Current Torrance County 4-H By-Laws state for a member to remain in good standing the member must complete the following:

- Attend 50% (6) regular club meetings during the current 4-H year and attend (4) prior to County Fair.
- Keep records of projects and turn them into the club leader.
- Give a demonstration or illustrated talk.
- Participate in two or more community service projects and two or more club activities and two or more club or county fundraisers.
- Meet all of the requirements before exhibiting any projects. Members must be enrolled in the projects they are exhibiting.
- 6. Exhibit projects at County/State Fair

Youth who are 19 on or by December 31 of the current 4-H year (2023) are not eligible to enroll as a 4-H member. 4-H Ages are based on the Member's Age as of January 1, 2024
