To enroll:

- Visit https://4h.zsuite.org/ you can use any browser, but Google Chrome works the best.
- If you have never used Zsuites before, start by creating a new account. If you have an existing Zsuite account, log in with your username and password.
 - **Detailed instruction on creating a new account can be found here: https://zsuite.s3.us-east-2.amazonaws.com/static/Help/ZSuiteHelp/Creatinganewaccount.html
 - **Zsuites works off of "households," which means you will only create one account for your entire family**
- Add household members for each of your youth needing to be enrolled as well as any adults in your household who will be enrolling as volunteers or club leaders (i.e., your spouse)

 - **Adults that are approved volunteers will need to enroll as *VOLUNTEERS*, unless you are the primary club leader for that particular club. If you would like to become a volunteer, please contact the Extension office for an application. If you are not planning to work with youth as a volunteer, you will register as a *PARENT*.
- 4. Enroll each youth and adult volunteer or parent.

Make sure to download the medical form, fill it out, and then upload the signed copy to each household member's accounts. You will not be approved on the county level until those forms are attached to your enrollment and complete with signatures. You can also auto sign if you have the Adobe feature.

Once you have completed enrollments, you will be approved by the county OR state (for volunteers).



4-H Club Scrapbook Instructions

Objective: To show what the club accomplished during the year.

Guidelines:

- At least 8 ½ x 11 inches, no larger than 12 x 15 inches. It could be a scrapbook, photo book or binder.
- Can be typed, handwritten or a combination of both.
- · Acid free paper is suggested, but not required.
- Can include pictures, drawings, articles, stories, etc. Remember to use captions or labels to describe the included items.
- Can highlight activities, projects, and community service that the club did during the past 4-H
 year from October 1st to September 30th.
- You should not include ribbons, scorecards, or evaluation sheets.
- The club can decide if the scrapbook will be completed by a club historian or a larger committee.
- Be creative! You may use stickers, gel pens, stencils, markers, patterned paper, drawings, cutouts, colored paper, computer graphics, etc.

Organization:

- Title Page that includes Club Name, Year and Historian's Name
- List of Club Members, Club Officers, Club Leaders with current photos
- List of Club Goals
- Copy of Club Charter (if the club has one)
- Calendar of Club Events
- Club Awards
- Correspondence (special letters only)
- 4- Club Year Story: This is your chance to tell the important events and accomplishments of the
 past year for your club. The story may be written as separate paragraphs on each page, along
 with pictures and other historical documents of each event, or it may be in one story with
 clippings or copies of published articles (underline member names) and photos (labeled with
 activity, date, and names) in a separate section that follows the story. In your story you may tell
 of delegates to conferences, camps, tours, award winners, and presentations at the county,
 district, and state levels.

Judged on:

- Title page complete
- Correct order of pages
- Photos with captions/labels
- Complete review of the club's activities for the year
- Neatness
- Creativity

MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING

According to State 4-H policy, a 4-H member shall attend at **least** 40% of all club meeting and activities. If a 4-H member does not meet this

requirement, they will not be a member in good standing.

Current Torrance County 4-H By-Laws state for a member to remain in good standing the member must complete the following:

- Attend 50% (6) regular club meetings during the current 4-H year and attend (4) prior to County Fair.
- Keep records of projects and turn them into the club leader.
- Give a demonstration or illustrated talk.
- Participate in two or more community service projects and two or more club activities and two or more club or county fundraisers.
- Meet all of the requirements before exhibiting any projects. Members must be enrolled in the projects they are exhibiting.
- 6. Exhibit projects at County/State Fair

- 4. Under 'You have earned a certificate' is a button that says "Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)'
- 5. Click on the blue 'Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)'
- Start Course

Complete course and a certificate will be available with the completion date. The county 4-H Zsuite administrator should be able to see the volunteer completion on his/her county page.

CLOVERBUDS: 5 to 8 years old AND in Kindergarten, 1st, or 2nd grade

NOVICE: 9 to 11 years old or 8 years old AND in the 3rd grade.

JUNIOR: 12 and 13 years old or 11 years old AND in the 6th grade.

SENIOR: 14-18 years old OR 13 years old AND in the 8th grade

Youth who are 19 on or by December 31 of the current 4-H year (2023) are not eligible to enroll as a 4-H member. 4-H Ages are based on the Member's Age as of January 1, 2024
