4-H Member Ages for 2025-2026 4-H Year

CLOVERBUDS: 5 to 8 years old AND in Kindergarten, 1st, or 2nd grade

NOVICE: 9 to 11 years old or 8 years old AND in the 3rd grade.

JUNIOR: 12 and 13 years old or 11 years old AND in the 6th grade.

SENIOR: 14 -18 years old OR 13 years old AND in the 8th grade

Youth who are 19 on or by December 31 of the current 4-H year (2025) are not eligible to enroll as a 4-H member. **4-H Ages are based on the Member's Age as of January 1, 2026**

To enroll:

1. Visit <https://4h.zsuite.org/> - you can use any browser, but Google Chrome works the best.
2. If you have never used Zsuites before, start by creating a new account. If you have an existing Zsuite account, log in with your username and password.

Zsuites works off of "households," which means you will *only create one account for your entire family*
3. Add household members for each of your youth needing to be enrolled as well as any adults in your household who will be enrolling as volunteers or club leaders (i.e., your spouse)

**Adults that are approved volunteers will need to enroll as *VOLUNTEERS*, unless you are the primary club leader for that particular club. If you would like to become a volunteer, please contact the Extension office for an application. If you are not planning to work with youth as a volunteer, you will register as a *PARENT*.
4. Enroll each youth and adult volunteer or parent.

Make sure to download the medical form, fill it out, and then upload the signed copy to each household member's accounts. You will not be approved on the county level until those forms are attached to your enrollment and complete with signatures. You can also auto sign if you have the Adobe feature.
Once you have completed enrollments, you will be approved by the county OR state (for volunteers).

Greetings from the Ag Agent:

4-H Agriculture and Natural Resources Updates:

•4-H Equine:

- * The Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC) and Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry have confirmed equine herpes myeloencephalopathy (EHM), the neurologic disease linked to equine herpes virus (EHV-1), in their respective states on November 18, 2025.
- * If you attended either the 2025 WPRA World Finals and Elite Barrel Race in Waco, TX on November 5-9, 2025 or the Barrel Futurities of America event in Guthrie, OK on November 17-18, 2025 be on watch for symptoms of EHM. Contact your veterinarian if you suspect anything.
- * If you have any questions or would like more information about EHM or EHV-1, please don't hesitate to reach out to me at angeladh@nmsu.edu.

•4-H Shooting Sports:

- * The 2026 NM State 4-H Shooting Sports Leader Training is scheduled for February 20-22 in Truth or Consequence, NM. MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING

According to State 4-H policy, a 4-H member shall attend at **least 40%** of all club meeting and activities. If a 4-H member does not meet this requirement, they will not be a member in good standing.

Current Torrance County 4-H By-Laws state for a member to remain in good standing the member must complete the following :

1. **Attend 50% (6) regular club meetings during the current 4-H year and attend (4) prior to County Fair.**
2. **Keep records of projects and turn them into the club leader.**
3. **Give a demonstration or illustrated talk.**
4. **Participate in two or more community service projects and two or more club activities and two or more club or county fundraisers.**
5. **Meet all of the requirements before exhibiting any projects. Members must be enrolled in the projects they are exhibiting.**
6. **Exhibit projects at County/State Fair**

Working With Minors Training - New Year started October 1

As we begin the new year, it is time for our volunteers to take the Working with Minors module for 2021-2022 year. To make this process easier, a reset button has been added. Please share these steps with your volunteers.

Once the volunteer is in his/her/family Zsuite account and has selected his/her profile follow the steps below:

1. Click on Clover Academy on left menu bar
2. Launch Clover Academy
3. Open NM Working with Minors (even though it says completed)
4. Under 'You have earned a certificate' is a button that says "Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)"
5. Click on the blue 'Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)'
6. Start Course

Complete course and a certificate will be available with the completion date. The county 4-H Zsuite administrator should be able to see the volunteer completion on his/her county page.
