- Thank you to everyone who attended the Torrance County Fair.
- As we continue with State fair season, keep the following tips in mind:

- * Never bring a sick animal to the show.
- * Bring equipment and supplies for feeding, watering, and cleaning pens.
- * Make sure animals have access to FRESH and clean water at all times; water can get too hot and animals might choose to stop drinking it, resulting in lower weights before show.
- * Keep animals thoroughly groomed and clean.
- * Keep stalls neat and clean.
- * Know the Fair Rules & Regulations before check-in for a smooth fair experience

- * NM State Rodeo Finals– September 19-21

• 4-H Livestock:

MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING

According to State 4-H policy, a 4-H member shall attend at **least 40%** of all club meeting and activities. If a 4-H member does not meet this requirement, they will not be a member in good standing.

Current Torrance County 4-H By-Laws state for a member to remain in good standing the member must complete the following :

1. **Attend 50% (6) regular club meetings during the current 4-H year and attend (4) prior to County Fair.**
2. **Keep records of projects and turn them into the club leader.**
3. **Give a demonstration or illustrated talk.**
4. **Participate in two or more community service projects and two or more club activities and two or more club or county fundraisers.**
5. **Meet all of the requirements before exhibiting any projects. Members must be enrolled in the projects they are exhibiting.**
6. **Exhibit projects at County/State Fair**

Once the volunteer is in his/her/family Zsuite account and has selected his/her profile follow the steps below:

1. Click on Clover Academy on left menu bar
2. Launch Clover Academy
3. Open NM Working with Minors (even though it says completed)
4. Under 'You have earned a certificate' is a button that says "Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)'
5. Click on the blue 'Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)'
6. Start Course

Complete course and a certificate will be available with the completion date. The county 4-H Zsuite administrator should be able to see the volunteer completion on his/her county page.
